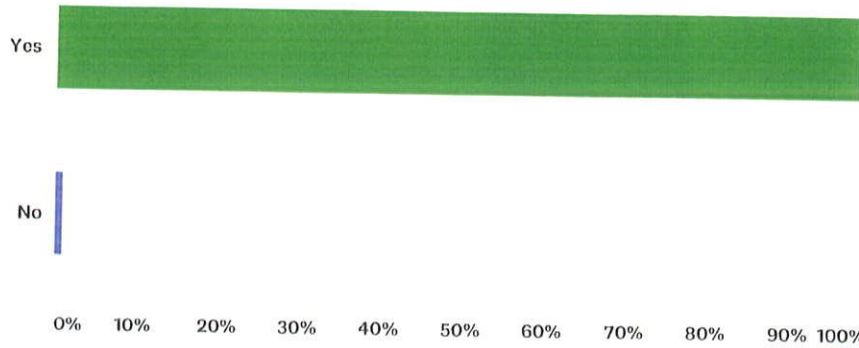


Did you or any of your guests use the beach this past summer (Memorial Day weekend to Labor Day weekend)?

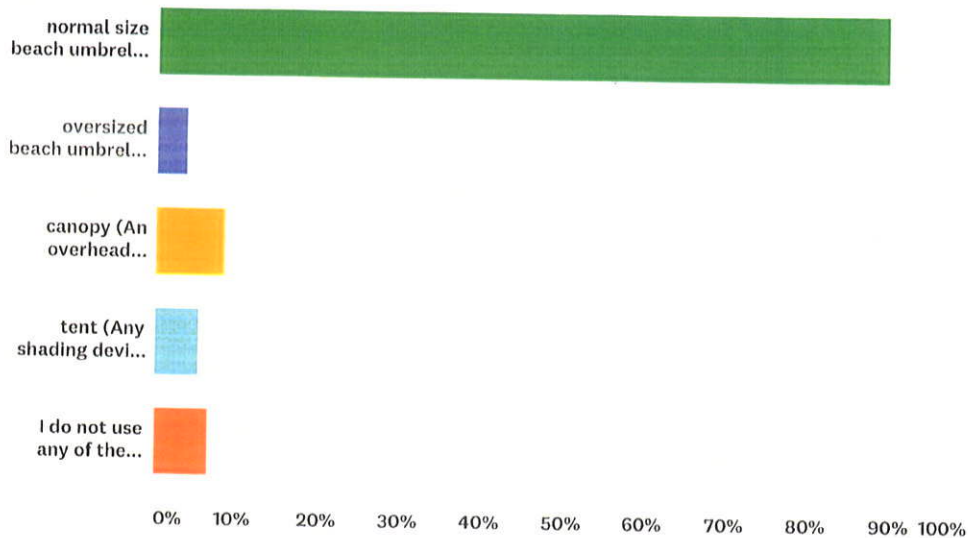

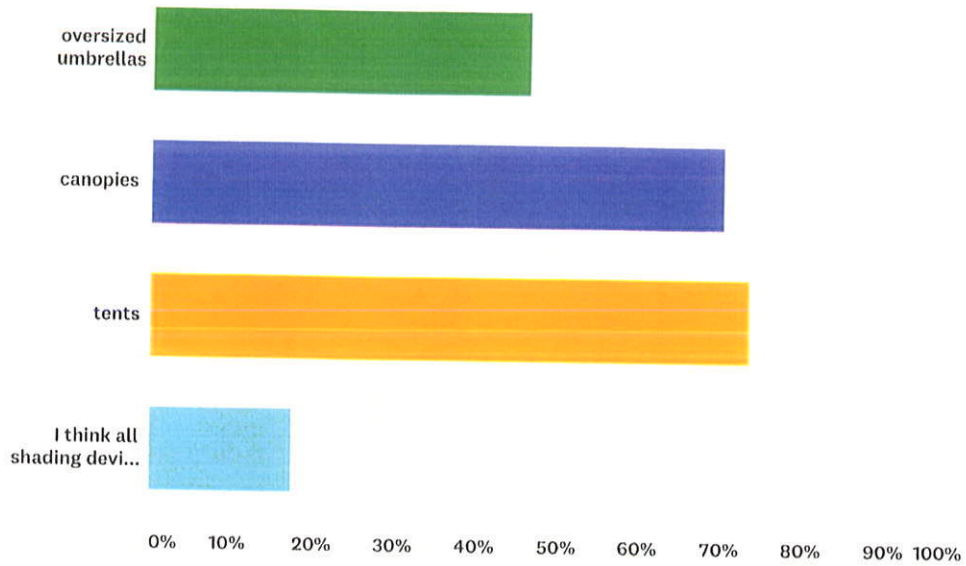

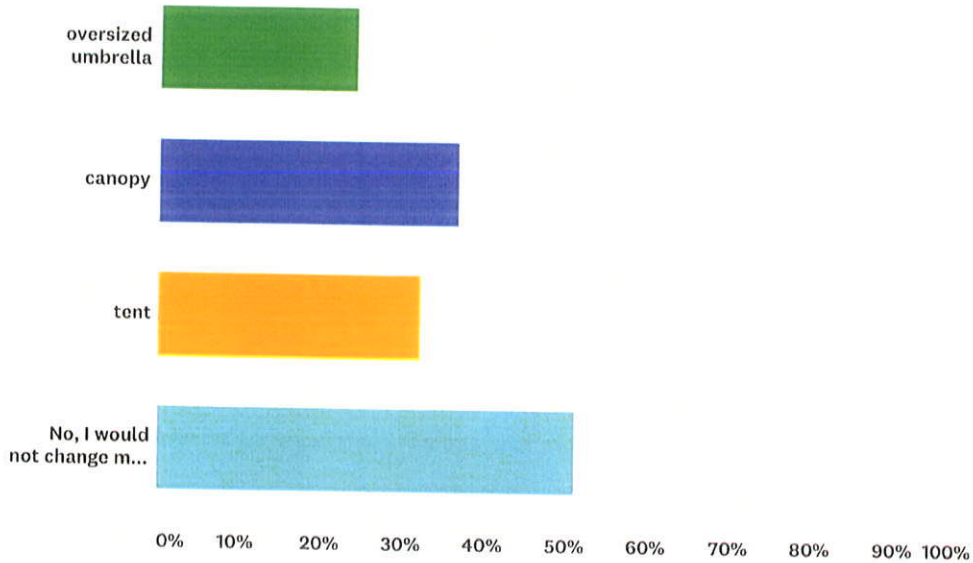
